



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4-H YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

In 2020, great progress was made in transitioning in person 4-H Youth Development programming into a virtual or hybrid format. Despite the restrictions and limitations presented by the COVID-19 pandemic, 4-H programming was

not only able to continue, but expanded in 2020. CCE Onondaga 4-H collaborated with more than 20 organizations in the county including: community centers, school districts, libraries, non-profit organizations, companies, city and state parks and recreation departments and Cornell University to provide a variety of community education programs and projects focused on youth development, which were attended by 3,477 youth and volunteers. Even amongst pandemic restrictions, CCE Onondaga 4-H expanded in the development of a new 4-H club at the Seals Community Center at Kirk Park in Syracuse, and held its first tabling event there in 2020.

4-H members have participated in various virtual activities such as animal science, geospatial science and technology, public speaking, family/consumer science and nutrition, gardening and arts and crafts, despite challenges presented by the COVID pandemic. In early 2020, pre-COVID, Governance Day was held for the first time in 4-H history at the Onondaga County Legislature where a proclamation was presented celebrating 101 years of 4-H in Onondaga County. 4-H youth also had an opportunity to tour the Cornell University Equine Hospital early in 2020. Post COVID, 4-H Public-Speaking Presentations, Annual 4-H Youth Fair, 4-H Dairy Clinic, "Leadership to Strengthen Our Communities"

program, Winter Weekend nature education event, and community service events were held either virtually or in person, utilizing COVID safety guidelines. At the Annual End of the Year 4-H Celebration, we reflected upon and celebrated




THIS SIDE UP

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Cornell Cooperative Extension of Onondaga County, in cooperation with New York State Agriculture and Markets, is providing a helping hand to farmers during the COVID-19 pandemic. Production farms of any type were welcomed at our new office location on Collamer Road in East Syracuse, picking up supplies. All parts of our food system were aided, including dairy, livestock, grape, and vegetable farms, farm stands, U-Picks, nurseries, equine, and craft beverage institutions. Pickup was designed to be contact-less, with orders organized outside of our second entrance and able be picked up at any time. PPE masks and sanitizer is still available for pickup!

Since May 11, 2020, CCE Onondaga has distributed over 700 gallons of hand sanitizer, 7,000 cloth face masks to 1,500 employees of Onondaga farms and u-pick operations. Our goal is to help farmers continue their work safely and to be able to sell their products safely.

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NATURAL RESOURCES

CCE Onondaga joined in partnership with Skaneateles Lake municipalities, the City of Syracuse and Onondaga County Soil and Water Conservation District (collectively known as the Skaneateles Watershed Municipal Partnership) to design a website for Skaneateles Lake. The Skaneateles Watershed Municipal Partnership's goal is to work collectively to bring the most up to date information regarding the Skaneateles Lake Watershed through the website, and to work together to promote a healthy future for the beautiful water source that is Skaneateles Lake.

Skaneateles Lake is a vital, shared natural resource for Central New York, providing recreational, aesthetic, and financial value to the community. The lake also serves as the primary drinking water source for residents in the watershed and the City of Syracuse. There are so many resources for information about topics affecting Skaneateles Lake, like harmful algal blooms, invasive species, and landscaping for water quality. However, this information was spread across several different websites, making it difficult to locate. The new Skaneateles Lake website pulls together all important information about the lake and its watershed in one place for those who live in, visit, recreate on, and love Skaneateles Lake.

In the fall of 2019, the City of Syracuse reached out to CCE Onondaga about putting together a website for the watershed. A partnership of municipalities interested in creating this website formed with CCE Onondaga taking the lead role in populating and designing the website, with feedback from the committee of stakeholders. Over the course of about eight months, the Skaneateles Watershed Municipal Partnership met and discussed content and changes for each draft version of the website.

CCE Onondaga and the Skaneateles Watershed Municipal Partnership collaborated on designing the website, which successfully launched on July 1st, 2020. CCE Onondaga Water and Ecology Educator, Camille Marcotte, was featured on the local Syracuse Bridge Street on News Channel 9 program to highlight the launch and talk about the new website (estimated reach of over 320,000 households).

The website has been an immense success - since its launch on July 1st, 2020, the website has 1,146 visits, 2,859 page views and 1,007 unique visitors.

Feedback from Skaneateles residents, stakeholders and other partners has been extremely positive. The website will serve as a hub of information about the lake and its watershed now and into the future, providing updates on harmful algae blooms, boat launch and wash station locations, answers to frequently asked questions, and more. For all watershed residents and anyone who enjoys visiting and recreating on Skaneateles Lake, this website provides comprehensive information on topics that contribute to promoting a healthy future for the lake and protecting its water quality.

The Skaneateles website is the result of a partnership between Cornell Cooperative Extension of Onondaga County, the City of Syracuse, Onondaga County Soil and Water Conservation District, and the Skaneateles Lake Watershed municipalities (Town of Niles, Town of Spafford, Town and Village of Skaneateles, Town of Scott, and Town of Sempronius).

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NUTRITION AND HEALTH

Food insecurity, meaning individuals having limited or uncertain access to enough food for a healthy and active lifestyle increased significantly with the onset of Covid -19 pandemic. Low income families eligible/ receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits were now faced with new problems with purchasing foods due to scarcity of food items in supermarkets because of food hoarding and panic purchasing in Onondaga County. In addition, individuals already financially struggling lost their jobs, were laid off or had reduced hours as a result of the pandemic complicated food insecurity matters. Food banks, food pantries and soup kitchens were now faced with an uptick in customers needing food to feed their families.

Nutrition educators worked with the coordinators of food pantries/soup kitchens on a weekly basis providing them with informational flyers in both English and Spanish on proper handwashing techniques, food planning during coronavirus, eating healthy on a budget, food resource management, physical activity and healthy recipes that could easily be modified/adapted based on availability of food in food pantries and supermarkets Over 16,500 resources were distributed to thousands of families in Onondaga County since Covid.

The SNAP Ed nutrition team in Onondaga County reached out to a total of 17 food pantries and soup kitchens to offer assistance during these uncertain times. The CCE Onondaga nutrition team continues to provide food pantries with resources that will help their customers save time, save money so they can eat healthy!

Westside PEACE site is a Family Resource Center (FRC), and serves as a food pantry to a mostly Hispanic population. CCE Onondaga's relationship with this agency started during Covid 19. Anita Bono, nutrition educator established a relationship with Stephanie Bingham, director of this site, in early May. She welcomed our materials and recipes, which were provided in both Spanish and English. She started adding them to the 85-90 food pantry boxes they distributed to the community each week.

Anita proposed the idea of an outdoor program, with all of our SNAP Ed and social distancing guidelines in place including having Stephanie finding a volunteer in the community to help with the food demonstration of a healthy recipe and finding a volunteer to recruit community members to attend the workshop with a staff member to translate the class for a Spanish audience, so all could participate.

The participants had many good questions and were eager to schedule another outdoor class while the weather allowed. At the end of the program, all participants left with a bag containing ALL the ingredients which would allow them to make a full recipe of "Fresh Corn Salad" at home, courtesy of PEACE.
