

Avian Influenza (HPAI)

The Onondaga County Health Department is reaching out to share information regarding the Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI), referred to as H5N1, that is widespread on dairy farms in many U.S. states.

Multiple cases of human infection with H5N1 have been reported over the past several months in the U.S. All were in dairy farm workers, and all had mild, self-limited symptoms. However, people have experienced severe respiratory illness and death in other outbreaks around the world.

To date, there have been no humans or cattle reported infected with H5N1 in New York State.
